HONORS DAY PROGRAM

ALPHA OMEGA ALPHA STUDENT RESEARCH AWARD: This award, given by the Mississippi Chapter of Alpha Omega Alpha, consists of a certificate and cash prize awarded to a medical student for the best original paper.

MEDICAL SCHOLARS RESEARCH PROGRAM: This program fosters the development of medical students into physician scientists who, in addition to patient care, will pursue clinical, population, or basic science research. From mentored research projects providing hands on experience to a lecture series on a broad array of topics, the research experience offered by the MSRP exposes students to a broad variety of medical research ongoing at the University of Mississippi Medical Center, helping to stimulate and promote students to consider careers in academic medicine.

ANATOMICAL SCIENCES AWARDS: These awards, given to medical students for scholastic excellence in the Anatomical Sciences during their freshman year are monetary along with a certificate.

IMP EXCELLENCE IN EMPATHIC COMMUNICATION AWARD: This award is given to a freshman medical student with the best performance during clinical encounters with real and standardized patients, with a focus on demonstrating compassionate, high-quality care to patients.

DEANS AWARDS: These annual awards, applied toward tuition, are given after the freshman year in medical school to the four students who have achieved the highest academic average. The awards are renewable annually if the recipient remains in the upper one-third of the class.

DAVID S. PANKRATZ SCHOLARSHIP: This award, in memory of the first dean of the four-year School of Medicine and first director of the Medical Center, is a cash prize given to a sophomore student in recognition of outstanding academic achievements in the freshman medical year.

CHARLES H. LANEY, M.D. MERIT AWARD: Established in 2014, honoring the exceptional career of Charles H. Laney, MD and the profound impact he had on the health of the citizens of Mississippi. The award is presented annually in recognition of outstanding academic achievement during the M1 year.

RAYMOND A. ALFORD MEMORIAL AWARD: Established by the Class of 1967 in memory of Raymond Alford, this award honors the sophomore medical student with the highest academic average during the freshman year. The student's name is engraved on a plaque with a cash prize.

BRADLEY BAKER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: Established by the Class of 1965 in memory of their classmate to assist a student in completing medical education, a cash prize and plaque are awarded to the student completing the sophomore year with academic excellence in the preclinical curriculum.

DOUGLASS WILLS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: Established by the Class of 1969 in memory of their classmate, this award goes to a sophomore student who exemplifies promise in medicine, scholarship, and good character.

PRICILLA LI SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AWARD: Established in 2015 in honor of the exceptional life of Pricilla Li; her passion for service and community, her genuine compassion for others, her dedication to education, patient care, and the medical profession. The award is presented on an annual basis to a second year medical student best demonstrating these qualities and attributes.

MILLER-PITTMAN MEDICAL SCHOLARSHIP: The Miller-Pittman Scholarship was established through a bequest from the late Mary Eugenia Miller. The scholarship is designed to assist "deserving medical students enrolled in this School of Medicine."

DARYL DOUGLAS MEMORIAL AWARD: Established by the Class of 1978 in memory of Daryl Douglas, a classmate, consists of a plaque on which are engraved the names of sophomore students who most consistently demonstrate readiness to serve and assist their classmates in the pursuit of medical knowledge and skills.

MARK T. SMITH MEMORIAL AWARD: Established by the Class of 2000 in memory of Mark Thompson Smith, a classmate, to a medical student with a true caring Christian spirit and attitude towards classmates, instructors, and patients, with intellectual curiosity in the field of medicine, and enthusiasm for life with a heartfelt smile even when confronted with a challenge.

CURTIS DELGADILLO ROBERTS, M.D. SCHOLARSHIP: The Curtis Delgadillo Roberts Scholarship honors the memory of the longtime Brandon family physician who died in 1989. The scholarship is awarded on the basis of exceptional merit and/or exceptional need and potential for successful completion of the four-year curriculum. Preference is given to Rankin County residents.

DR. M. WINTER JACKSON MEDICAL SCHOLARSHIP: This scholarship is awarded on the basis of academic standing, potential for growth and development in the chosen field, and need.

MEDICAL ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP: The Medical Alumni Scholarship, established in 1996 by the Medical Alumni Chapter, is awarded to a medical student based on academic criteria and financial need.

MARGIE BULBOFF AWARD: Established in 2001 by the Medical Alumni Chapter in honor of Margie Bulboff who nurtured medical students in pathology from 1959 through her retirement in 1991, this award is presented to a sophomore medical student selected on the basis of good academic standing and ability to balance academics with family, community, philanthropic service, and intramural activities.

ROBERT CLAYTON MAYNOR, JR. LEADERSHIP AWARD: This award is presented annually to a junior or senior medical student who has demonstrated exceptional leadership to his/her class and/or the student body.

HATTIESBURG PHYSICIANS' SCHOLARSHIP: This scholarship was established in 1983 by the Board of Directors of the Hattiesburg Community Blood Center, Inc. The award recipient must be a sophomore or junior in the upper one-third of the class. Preference is given to a medical student from the Hattiesburg area.

CHARLES L. DODGEN MEMORIAL AWARD: This award is given to a freshman for outstanding academic performance. Dr. Dodgen was on the UMC faculty from 1958-1980 and was serving as chairman of the School of Medicine Admissions Committee at the time of his death.

WILLIAM FORREST HUTCHISON AWARD: Established in 1996 by the family of the late William Forrest Hutchison, who was a member of the School of Medicine faculty from 1955 until 1990, this award is given to a sophomore medical student who demonstrates excellence in and a commitment to community service.

DR. AND MRS. HENRY O. LEONARD SCHOLARSHIP: Junior medical students who are in good academic standing and plan careers in Family Medicine are eligible for this scholarship, established in 1988. The scholarship may be renewed for the recipient's senior year.

REGIONS BANK SCHOLARSHIP: The Regions Bank Scholarship is presented to a senior medical student in recognition of outstanding academic achievement and promise in the field of medicine.

TRUSTMARK NATIONAL BANK SCHOLARSHIP: The Trustmark National Bank Scholarship, established in 1988, is awarded to a junior medical student in recognition of scholastic excellence.

BLANCHE LOCKHARD SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT IN MEDICINE: The Blanche Lockhard Scholarship is designated for a deserving female medical student.

CLINICAL SKILLS ASSESSMENT AWARD: This award recognizes a senior medical student in recognition of outstanding performance on Clinical Skills Assessment examinations and exemplary professionalism during activities at the Judith Gore Gearhart Clinical Skills and Assessment Center.

HELEN REEVES TURNER, M.D., PH.D. SCHOLARSHIP AWARD: This award established in 2013 is awarded each year to a deserving student from one of the Medical Center Schools. The recipient of this award, is selected by the dean or his designee, exemplifies Dr. Turner's outstanding attributes of leadership, education, and service.

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE LEADERSHIP AWARD: In recognition of outstanding leadership and service to the University of Mississippi School of Medicine student body, this award is given annually to deserving class leaders from the second, third, or fourth year.

MEYER AND GENEVIEVE FALK ENDOWMENT AWARD: This award is presented annually to deserving medical students in the second, third, and fourth years of training.

BILLY S. GUYTON, M.D. SCHOLARSHIP: This scholarship was established in 2016 through a bequest from the late Billy S. Guyton. The scholarship fund's intention is to support medical education at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine and is awarded on an annual basis to one or more worthy medical students.

JOHN HOUSTON WEAR FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP: Established as a trust to aid worthy students, these scholarships are awarded for academic excellence.

DR. THAIS TONORE JOY OF FAMILY MEDICINE AWARD: Sponsored by the Department of Family Medicine is presented to a senior student pursuing a career in Family Medicine who has demonstrated compassion and integrity in patient care, shown exemplary professionalism, and exhibits a zeal for the specialty of Family Medicine. The award consists of a cash prize and a plaque.

RICE-HOLLAND MEMORIAL AWARD: Established in memory of Dr. James C. Rice and Dr. William C. Holland, former chairmen of the Department of Pharmacology and Toxicology, this cash prize is awarded to an outstanding medical student in pharmacology.

JULIUS M. CRUSE AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN PATHOLOGY: This award is given to a capable sophomore medical student who shows special promise for a career in pathology. The tangible components of this award are a cash prize and a certificate, both from the Department of Pathology.

ERNEST W. GOODPASTURE AWARD: This cash prize and certificate are sponsored by the Department of Pathology and presented to the sophomore medical student with the highest grade in pathology.

BRENDA JOY NICHOLSON PRITCHARD, M.D. SCHOLARSHIP: Established in 1999 with a bequest from the Estate of Sarah Margaret Ridgell Nicholson and named for her daughter, a graduate of University of Mississippi School of Medicine and Pathology Residency, this scholarship is given to a deserving medical student ranked in the top half of his class with financial need.

VIRGINIA COVINGTON AWARD: Established by the Class of 2006, this award consisting of a cash prize and certificate is given to a medical student or resident participating in a medical mission trip. The recipient should be viewed as a role model and demonstrate a compassion for others.

THOMAS M. (PETER) BLAKE AWARD: Established in 2001 by the Department of Medicine in honor of Dr. Blake who served as the course director for Physical Diagnosis from 1955-1990, this award consists of an engraved plaque and check. This award is presented to a medical student in recognition of academic excellence in the Introduction to Clinical Medicine course and a pursuit of knowledge, professionalism, and reliance on self rather than others in the ultimate achievement of his/her own goals.

J. ROBERT SNAVELY AWARD: Established in memory of Dr. Snavely, first chairman of the Department of Medicine, this award goes to a senior medical student for outstanding performance in the clinical medicine block. The recipient's name is engraved on a perpetual plaque in the Department of Medicine and the recipient receives a check and certificate.

JAMES E. GRIFFITH (GRIFF) AWARD: The James E. Griffith Pulmonary Award is sponsored by the American Lung Association and is in memory of Dr. James E. Griffith. It is given yearly to a fourth-year medical student who shows interest in pulmonary medicine.

MEDICAL STUDENT PRIZE FOR EXCELLENCE IN NEUROLOGY: Sponsored by the American Academy of Neurology, this cash prize is presented to the senior student demonstrating excellence in neurology as well as personal qualities of integrity, compassion, and leadership. The student also receives a certificate of recognition.

DEPARTMENT OF SURGERY PRIZE: This prize is given by the Department of Surgery to a senior medical student for outstanding performance during the junior surgery block.

DEPARTMENT OF SURGERY SURGICAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM: During the summer before their M2 year, selected students observe and assist their assigned faculty mentor in surgical cases and during clinic visits. Students may also participate in research activities. The mentors serve as advisors to the students throughout the remainder of their medical education.

PAULA NICOLE ("NIKKI") SHOEMAKE-PATTERSON, M.D., MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: The purpose of the endowment is to support the School of Medicine fourth year female students interested in surgery and to honor in perpetuity, Paula Nicole "Nikki" Shoemake-Patterson, alumna of the UMMC School of Medicine Class of 2003.

DONALD T. IMRIE AWARD: Established by the Department of Orthopedic Surgery in honor of Dr. Imrie, this book and certificate are awarded to a senior medical student for outstanding performance in orthopedic surgery.

WILLIAM B. GALLAGHER AWARD: Established in 1969 in memory of the late Dr. Gallagher, a former resident, this award consists of a cash prize and plaque engraved with the recipient's name. It is awarded to the most outstanding student in obstetrics and gynecology.

J.P. "JAKE" MILLS AWARD: Established in 2000 in memory of J. P. "Jake" Mills of Tupelo, who served on the Board of Trustees of Institutions of Higher Learning from January, 1992, until his death on April 17, 1999. Students eligible for this award are seniors who have matched for residency training in obstetrics and gynecology. Preference is given to those students who plan to practice in Mississippi.

JOEY PURVIS MEMORIAL FUND AWARD: The Joey Purvis Memorial Fund Award honors Joey Purvis, a member of the Class of 2002, who was killed in an automobile accident while in route to Pennsylvania State University Medical Center to interview for a residency position in Obstetrics and Gynecology. The award goes to the medical student who best exemplifies Joey's caring concern for patients and fellow students.

MISSISSIPPI BLOOD SERVICES SCHOLARSHIP: The purpose of the endowment is to provide income for scholarships to assist deserving medical students who are attending The University of Mississippi Medical Center.

DEPARTMENT OF OPHTHALMOLOGY AWARD: This award and cash prize are awarded to a senior medical student for excellence in the field of ophthalmology.

DEPARTMENT OF OTOLARYNGOLOGY AND COMMUNICATIVE SCIENCES AWARD: This book award and certificate are awarded to a senior medical student for excellence in the field of otolaryngology.

BLAIR E. BATSON AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN PEDIATRICS: The Batson Award was established to recognize the graduating medical student whose clinical performance and devotion to pediatrics were judged superior in the class by the pediatric faculty. It is given in honor of Dr. Blair E. Batson, first chairman of the Department of Pediatrics, who devoted his career to the education of students and the promotion of children's health.

CHARLES PRESTON WINTERS SCHOLARSHIP: Established by the Charles Preston Winters Foundation, this scholarship is designated for a senior medical student in good standing who plans to go into pediatrics.

THOMAS J. BROOKS, JR. PREVENTIVE MEDICINE AWARD: Established in honor of Dr. Thomas J. Brooks, Jr., first chairman of the Department of Preventive Medicine, the award is given annually to a medical student who has demonstrated academic excellence in public health/preventive medicine-related coursework and who has shown continued involvement at the Jackson Free Clinic or medicine efforts and programs in Mississippi and/or global and international health activities.

REAR ADMIRAL DENNIS WRIGHT MILITARY MEDICAL STUDENT AWARD: This award honoring Rear Admiral Dennis Wright, a 1968 graduate of the School of Medicine, is presented to a medical student enrolled in a military program, in recognition of outstanding achievement in medical course work.

MISSISSSIPPI PSYCHIATRIC ASSOCIATION OUTSTANDING SENIOR MEDICAL STUDENT AWARD: Established by the Mississippi Psychiatric Association, this certificate is awarded to the senior student with a natural aptitude within the field of psychiatry who expresses through residency selection a strong desire to assist the growing need for psychiatric care to our Mississippi population.

MEDICAL STUDENT PROFESSIONALISM AND SERVICE AWARD IN EMERGENCY MEDICINE: This award, sponsored by the Society for Academic Emergency Medicine and the Department of Emergency Medicine, is presented to a senior medical student emergency medicine bound for recognition of outstanding care to patients in a manner that exemplifies professionalism and a humanistic approach to patients, their families, and fellow health care workers.

EXCELLENCE IN EMERGENCY MEDICINE AWARD: This award sponsored by the Society of Academic Emergency Medicine is presented to a senior medical student who has demonstrated outstanding proficiency in emergency medicine.

LEONARD W. FABIAN AWARD: Established in 1992 by the Department of Anesthesiology to honor its first chairman, this award consists of a certificate and cash award given to a senior medical student in recognition of outstanding achievements in anesthesiology.

ROBERT D. SLOAN AWARD: This award, which consists of a plaque and a book, is presented in honor of Dr. Sloan, first chairman of the Department of Radiology, to an outstanding senior medical student in the field of radiology.

EVERS SOCIETY LEADERSHIP AWARD: This award, consisting of a certificate and cash prize, is presented to an upper-class medical student who has demonstrated outstanding leadership skill in satisfying the charge of the Carl G. Evers Society. The Society was established in 1997 as an honorary and service organization composed of medical students. The body seeks to improve medical education at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine primarily through the evaluation of course work required in the preclinical and clinical years of medical school.

JACKSON FREE CLINIC SERVICE AWARD: This award, consisting of an individual plaque, is presented to the senior students on the board of directors for the Jackson Free Clinic who have willingly given their time and persistent effort in fulfilling the mission of the clinic: To provide hope and healthcare to the uninsured of Mississippi while enriching the education of students.

MISSISSIPPI MEDICAL ASSOCIATION AWARD: This special award is presented to medical students in the third and fourth year of training, recognizing outstanding academic achievement and promise.

CARL GUSTAV EVERS AWARD: Established in 1993 by the Mississippi State Medical Association Foundation in memory of Dr. Carl G. Evers, professor of pathology and associate dean for academic affairs, who died November 19, 1992, this award consists of a plaque and a cash prize. The award is given to a senior medical student who has demonstrated qualities of scholarship, peer to peer support, and exceptional leadership in student activities of the American Medical Association and the Mississippi State Medical Association.

VIRGINIA STANSEL TOLBERT AWARD: This cash prize and plaque are given to a medical student who has demonstrated superior scholarship and leadership in campus activities. Additionally, the recipient must exhibit interest in issues which affect the profession and willingness to devote time and effort to those matters.

HELEN R. TURNER ACADEMIC MEDICINE AWARD: Established in 2012 by the University of Mississippi School of Medicine, honors Dr. Helen Turner and her remarkable service to the institution. Her contributions to academic medicine have laid a foundation for success to benefit the next generation of health care professionals, their future patients, and the communities in which they will serve. This award is presented to a fourth year medical student selected on the basis of demonstrated promise in the field of academic medicine.

DR. WALLY CONERLY COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD: Established in 2003 by the Mississippi State Medical Association and sponsored by School of Medicine in honor of A. Wallace Conerly, M.D., vice-chancellor emeritus for health affairs and dean emeritus of the School of Medicine, this award is given to a medical student who most exemplifies Dr. Conerly's outstanding attributes of leadership, community outreach, and service.

LEONARD TOW HUMANISM IN MEDICINE AWARD: Recognizes graduating student and faculty member who demonstrate both clinical excellence and outstanding compassion in the delivery of care and who show respect for patients, their families, and healthcare colleagues. Since 1991, the Arnold P. Gold Foundation has been recognizing Leonard Tow recipients throughout the nation, and this year, we have three Mississippi winners of this award. Each will receive a certificate and a check for one thousand dollars. The student and faculty recipient were nominated and voted on by the Class of 2019 Gold Humanism Honor Society.

JAMES C. WAITES, M.D., MEDICAL STUDENT OF THE YEAR AWARD: Sponsored by the Mississippi Physicians Care Network, this award honors the memory of Dr. Waites, a long-time family physician in Laurel, member of the School of Medicine Class of 1958, and role model for countless students in the compassionate care of patients. The award, a cash prize and plaque designation, is presented to a graduating senior medical student selected by the senior class in recognition of those qualities most desired in a physician and exemplified by Dr. Waites.

PROFESSOR OF THE YEAR AWARDS: Established by the University of Mississippi Medical Alumni Chapter, these awards consist of a cash prize in recognition of teaching excellence. The clinical professor is selected by the senior class and the preclinical professor by the sophomore class.

~ PREVIOUSLY AWARDED ~

ALPHA OMEGA ALPHA INITIATES: AOA, national honorary medical society, was installed on the Medical Center campus in 1958. Undergraduate membership is based entirely on scholarship, personal honesty, and leadership potential. Alumnus membership is granted for distinctive achievement in the art and practice of scientific medicine, and honorary membership is granted to eminent leaders in medicine and the allied sciences.

PHI KAPPA PHI INITIATES: Medical students in the top 10 percent of their graduating class are eligible for membership in this national honorary scholastic fraternity. The University chapter of Phi Kappa Phi was installed on the Oxford campus in 1959.

GOLD HUMANISM HONOR SOCIETY INDUCTEES: Founded in 2002 by Arthur P. Gold, M.D., this society recognizes and advances excellence in humanism in medicine nationally. The D. Jeanette Pullen, M.D. Chapter, established in the School of Medicine in 2005, was named in honor of Dr. Pullen, Professor Emeritus of Pediatrics, whose career in Pediatric Hematology/Oncology demonstrated exemplary service to others, integrity, clinical excellence, and compassionate and respectful relationships with patients, families, and colleagues. Senior medical students are selected on basis of their outstanding humanistic qualities.

MISSISSIPPI RURAL PHYSICIANS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM: Established in 2007 by the Mississippi Legislature that created a longitudinal program to identify rural college students who aspire to return to their roots to practice medicine.

L.D. WEBB, M.D. MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: Established in 1990 with a bequest from Dr. Webb, a family practitioner in Calhoun City for more than 35 years, this scholarship, awarded to a freshman medical student, is renewable for each year of medical school if the recipient maintains good academic standing. Preference is given to students from northeast Mississippi.

JOHN L. LUCAS, SR., M.D. SCHOLARSHIP: Established by the family and friends of Dr. Lucas, an obstetricsgynecologist in Greenwood for more than 48 years, this scholarship is awarded to a freshman medical student from LeFlore, Sunflower, Washington, Bolivar, Humphreys, or Yazoo County.

HAZEL WILMINGTON MEDICAL SCHOLARSHIP: Established in 1992, this scholarship is awarded to a freshman medical student based on demonstrated financial need and overall promise in medicine. The scholarship is renewable each year if the recipient maintains good academic standing.

MARIBEL BARBER SCHOLARSHIP IN MEDICINE: A scholarship awarded to an admitted freshman who shows outstanding academic promise, this award continues annually until the student is graduated.

ROBERT E. AND MARGARET N. SHANDS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: This scholarship was established in 1963 by Mrs. Robert E. Shands in memory of her husband. The Shands children re-designated the scholarship as a memorial to both their parents in 2000.

THOMAS M. "PETER" BLAKE SCHOLARSHIP: The Thomas M. "Peter" Blake Scholarship is made possible by a directed gift that Dr. Blake made to the Community Foundation of Greater Jackson. The scholarship is given on the basis of merit, demonstrated ability and willingness on the part of the student to accept responsibility, exercise initiative and use innovative approaches. Dr. Blake joined the faculty in 1955 as the institution's first cardiologist and remained active until his death in 2002.

OTTILLE SCHILLIG MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: This fund was established in 1984 through a gift to the Medical Center from the Schillig Trust. At least one scholarship is available each year in the School of Medicine. Recipients must be in good academic standing.

JAMES T. BAIRD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: The James T. Baird Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in 2000 through a gift to the Medical Center. At least one scholarship is available each year in the School of Medicine. All recipients must be in good academic standing, and preference is given to those students who intend to practice in smaller Mississippi towns and communities.

ROBERT M. HEARIN SUPPORT FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP: Established by the Robert M. Hearin Support Foundation, this scholarship provides full tuition to an outstanding student selected on the basis of the premedical record and financial need.

ROBERT M. HEARIN SUPPORT FOUNDATION MINORITY SCHOLARSHIP: These scholarships are available to minority students who, in the opinion of the Admissions Committee, are most likely to provide health care to under-served Mississippians.

NORMAN C. NELSON, M.D., SCHOLARSHIP: The Norman C. Nelson, M.D. Scholarship, established as the Dean's Scholarship in 1988, was designated in Dr. Nelson's name in 1994 in honor of his 21 year tenure as vice chancellor for health affairs and dean of the School of Medicine. This scholarship provides full tuition for a student who has exceptional scholastic potential. This scholarship is renewable each year if the recipient remains in good academic standing.

MAX, DORIS, AND JEWEL BLACKMON TRUST FUND SCHOLARSHIP: This scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student based on academic potential and financial need. Preference is given to students who intend to practice in Mississippi.

PEARL L. AND OTIS WALTERS SCHOLARSHIP: This scholarship was established through a bequest from the Walters to the University of Mississippi Foundation.

NINA BESS GOSS-MOFFITT, M.D. SCHOLARSHIP: Established by Dr. Ellis M. Moffitt in 1999 in memory of his wife, Dr. Nina Bess Goss-Moffitt, who was a longtime member of the Medical Center Department of Psychiatry and Human Behavior faculty, is a full tuition scholarship. The scholarship is designated for a female student and is awarded on the basis of need and potential for successful completion of the four-year curriculum. The scholarship is renewable each year if the recipient remains in good academic standing.

WILLIAM K. PURKS, M.D., MERIT SCHOLARSHIP: Established by the Vicksburg Hospital Medical Foundation in 1990, this scholarship is awarded to a freshman medical student selected on the basis of outstanding academic achievement, character, and potential in the field of medicine. The scholarship may be renewed for each year of medical school.
