We also are working to constantly improve our curriculum, increasing the number of outside Grand Rounds speakers, and encouraging our residents to take advantage of their third year dermatology elective to train in areas where we do not have expertise. 
The UMMC Department of Dermatology is making good progress toward a goal of developing a world-class department. Our mission is clear:

We have very sadly bid goodbye to our recently graduated residents, Drs. Kenneth Saul and Kathleen Casamiquela.


